5.2 SPECIAL HAZARDS ARISING FROM THE SUBSTANCE OR

MIXTURE: FIRE AND EXPLOSION HAZARD: DANGEROUS FIRE HAZARD WHEN EXPOSED TO HEAT OR FLAME. 5.3 <u>ADVICE FOR FIREFIGHTERS</u>: Shut off source. Keep unnecessary people away; isolate hazard area and deny entry. Avoid breathing vapors, stay upwind Do not spray pool fires directly. Caution: Spontaneous polymerization can occur if material is released or mixed with incompatibles. Contaminated monomer may be unstable. Add inhibitor to prevent polymerization. 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 <u>PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFE HANDLING</u>: This material presents a fire hazard. Invisible vapor spreads easily and can be set on fire by many sources, such as pilot lights, welding equipment, and electrical motors and switches. Vapor is heavier than air and can travel considerable distance to a source of ignition and flash back. Avoid breathing vapors in top of shipping container. Do not take internally.
